A perennial, warm-season grass that forms large clumps with airy seeds. Can be grown in a large range of soils.



Little Bluestem Schizachrium scoparium

Height: 3' Soil: Dry Light: Sun



A warm-season grass that will turn pinkish-gold in fall with silvery seed heads. Bunch grasses provide habitat for nesting pollinators.



Chokecherry Trees

Height: 12-25' Soil: Dry to Moist Light: Sun

Prunus virainiana

If you are looking for smaller trees that allow you to view more of the lake, the Chokecherry is exceptional.



Serviceberry Amelanchier

Height: 15-25' Soil: Dry to Moist Light: Sun The Serviceberry produces berries in June which provide an early food source for many wildlife species.

Sweet Flag Acorus americanus

Height: 2' Soil: Wet Light: Sun

Blooms: June-July

Naturally occurring in Wisconsin wetlands, Sweet flag provides shoreline stabilization where present. A sweet smell is emitted from its leaves, especially when crushed.



Sweet Fern Comptonia peregina

Height: 2'

Soil: Moist to Wet Light: Sun to Partial Shade Thrives in open areas with sandy soils. The Sweet fern is great for erosion control and fixes nitrogen in the soil as well.



Redosier Dogwood Cornus sericea

Height: 4-10' Soil: Moist to Wet

Light: Sun

Blooms: June-July

Known for stream bank protection, erosion control, and wildlife value, the Redosier dogwood is a great all-around bush to have in a shoreline landscape design.



Bush Honeysuckle Diervilla lonicera

Height: 1-4' Soil: Dry to Moist Light: Sun to Shade Blooms: June-July

Found throughout the state of Wisconsin, this plant is excellent for erosion control and grows well on slopes. It is also a favorite of hummingbirds!



Northern Bayberry Myrica gale

Height: 5-6' Soil: Wet

Light: Partial Shade to Sun

Blooms: July

Typically found in northern Wisconsin. The leaves are sweetly scented and are known as a natural insect repellent.



Barren Strawberry Waldsteinia ternata

Height: 6" Soil: Moist to Wet

Light: Sun Blooms: June Good groundcover for dry to moist woods. Also good for slowing erosion on sloped

areas.



Ferns and Grasses

Sensitive Fern Onoclea sensibilis

Height: 15" Soil: Moist

Light: Sun to Shade

Highly adaptable spreading fern. Dark brown fruiting body prominent in the fall.

Interrupted Fern Osmunda claytonia

Height: 3-4'

Soil: Moist to Wet

standing water. Fertile frond Light: Partial Shade to Shade interrupted by spores.



Big Bluestem Andropogon gerardii

Height: 6' Soil: Moist to Dry Light: Sun

Warm season bunchgrass useful for stopping wind erosion. Strong and deep root systems with stems turning blue or purple.



Bottlebrush Grass

Height: 5' Soil: Wet

Light: Sun to Partial Shade

Elymus hystrix/Hystrix patula A cool season grass with long, stiff, widely spaced bristles on the seed head. Grows during spring and fall when soil is cooler.



Wild Bergamot Monarda fistulosa

Height: 3-4' Soil: Moist to Wet

Light: Sun Blooms: July

Wild bergamot, also known as bee balm, is a favorite for bees and other pollinators. It is also adaptable to most soil conditions and has a unique purple flower.



Solomon's Seal Polygonatum biflorum

Height: 1-3'

Soil: Moist to Dry

Light: Partial Shade to Shade

Blooms: June

This plant has small greenish bells on the bottom side of large leaves producing blueblack berries in the fall.



Black Eyed Susan Rudbeckia hirta

Height: 15" Soil: Moist to Wet

Light: Sun

Blooms: July—August

A self-sowing annual or biennial with large yellow flowers that bloom in August. Good hardy plant, useful for shoreline erosion and run-off control.



Showy Goldenrod Solidago speciosa

Height: 1-3' Soil: Dry Light: Sun Blooms: August The Showy goldenrod is great for well-drained soils. Many species of goldenrods are well suited for shoreline landscaping. Other species include: Solidago canadensis, Solidago flexicaulis, Solidago

nemoralis.



Blue Vervain Verbena hastata

Height: 5' Soil: Wet Light: Sun Blooms: August Self-sowing biennial with slender, blue, flower spires. Naturally occurring on shorelines throughout the state. Another favorite for butterflies and other pollinators.



Smooth Rose Rosa blanda

Height: 1-4' Soil: Dry to Moist Light: Sun

Blooms: June—July

Typically blooms 1-4 flowers after maturity. The Smooth rose also produces bright red berries.



Meadowsweet Spirea alba

Height: 3-5' Soil: Moist to Wet Light: Sun

Blooms: July

Downy Arrowwood Viburnum Viburnum Rafinesquianum

Height: 3-6' Soil: Drv

Light: Partial Shade to Shade

Blooms: June

Produces white flower clusters with blue berries and beautiful fall colors. Enjoys drier soils and has many uses for wildlife.



Highbush Cranberry Viburnum trilobum

Height: 3-6' Soil: Moist Light: Sun Blooms: July Displays brilliant fall colors ranging from red to yellow. A hardy plant, tolerating many habitats, makes the Highbush cranberry an easier-to-grow native shrub.



Ground Cover Plants

Pearly Everlasting Anaphalis Margaritacea

Height: 8-12" Soil: Dry Light: Sun Blooms: August

Member of the Aster family. Host plant for the American Painted Lady butterfly caterpillar.



Howell's Pussytoes Antennaria howellii

Height: 4-10" Soil: Dry Light: Sun Blooms: July

Name originates from the flower's resemblance to a cat paw. Forms small matlike clusters.



Wild Columbine Aquilegia canadensis

Height: 2' Soil: Moist to Dry Light: Partial Shade Blooms: June

Popular nectar source for hummingbirds. Its long redorange, bell-like flowers makes the Wild columbine very recognizable.



Wild Sarsaparilla Aralia nudicaulis

Height: 1-1.5' Soil: Moist to Dry

Light: Partial Shade to Shade

Blooms: June

A good, woodland, ground cover plant that produces berries enjoyed by wildlife. Can tolerate slightly acidic soils.



New England Aster Aster novae-angliae

Height: 2-4' Soil: Moist to Dry Light: Sun Blooms: August

Popular for its showy purple flowers, long blooming time, and preference by monarch butterflies. Other great asters include: Eurybia macrophylla, Aster asureus, Aster divaricata, Aster ericoides, and Aster laevis.



Purple Coneflower Echinacea purpurea

Height: 3-4' Soil: Dry to Moist Light: Sun Blooms: July

Many pollinators are attracted to its purple showy flowers, while its seeds are a great food source for the American goldfinch during the fall.




Fireweed Epilobium angustifolium

Height: 2-4' Soil: Dry to Moist Light: Sun

Blooms: August—September

The Hairy sunflower produces seeds that are enjoyed by many bird species. Its rhizomes are eaten by small mammals as



Blue Flag Iris Iris versicolor

Height: 2' Soil: Moist to Wet

Light: Sun Blooms: June

Blue flag iris has brilliant blue-violet flowers and can tolerate shallow water.
