A statewide, one-day event connecting water lovers, volunteers, and local conservation groups in a search for aquatic invasive species (AIS). Help protect Wisconsin's rivers, lakes, and wetlands from these invasive plants and animals that negatively impact habitat, wildlife, recreation, and health.

After a short training, volunteers will look for AIS at critical monitoring sites where they will be verified and cataloged with the Wisconsin DNR to guide species control and conservation management plans.
