Prohibitions Already in State law

- A livestock operation shall have no overflow of manure storage facilities. NR 151.08
- A livestock operation shall have no unconfined manure stack in a
 water quality management area (this includes sites that are susceptible to groundwater contamination or that has the potential to be a
 direct conduit for contamination to reach groundwater, the area
 within 1000' of the high water mark of navigable waters that consist of a lake, pond, or flowage, or the area within 300' from the
 ordinary high water mark of navigable waters that consist of a river
 or stream). NR 151.08
- A livestock operation shall have no direct runoff from a feedlot or stored manure into the waters of the state. NR 151.08
- A livestock operation may not allow unlimited access by livestock to waters of the state in a location where high concentrations of animals prevent the maintenance of adequate sod or self-sustaining vegetative cover. Properly designed, installed, and maintained livestock or farm equipment crossings are exempt. NR 151.08

Specific to Oneida County

- Manure storage facilities or manure stacks of any size may not be located:
 - -within 100' of any property line
 - -within 100' of the nearest point of any public road right of way
 - -within 250' of a well
- A manure storage facility may not be located within:
 - -1000' of the ordinary high water mark of a navigable inland lake, flowage, or wetland
 - -300' from a navigable stream or river
 - -300' of a wetland that is independent of, or not in contact with, a navigable inland lake or flowage
 - -300' of an intermittent stream, or the wetlands that are part of the intermittent stream's course
- Manure stacks of any size may not be located within:
 - -250' from a navigable inland lake, flowage, or navigable stream
 - -100' of a wetland
- Stacks should be field spread and incorporated during the next field season following placement and under no circumstances shall a covered temporary manure stack, including composted manure, remain longer than 180 days. Under: DEFINITION section.
- Stacks should be field spread and incorporated during the next field season following placement and under no circumstances shall an unconfined manure stack, or covered temporary manure stack, remain longer than 180 days. Under: A PERMIT IS NOT REQUIRED section.
